

AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

AND

ALFRED DE GRAZIA

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 25th day of June, 1964, by and between the Government of the United States of America, (hereinafter referred to as the "Government"), acting through the Department of State (hereinafter referred to as the "Department"), and Dr. Alfred de Grazia, a citizen of the United States, residing at 7-13 Washington Square North, New York, New York, (hereinafter referred to as the "Contractor").

WHEREAS, the Department requires a report on completed research in Behavioral Sciences relating to foreign policy, and

WHEREAS, no one within the Department is available and qualified to perform this study, and

WHEREAS, the Contractor is qualified and available and hereby expresses his willingness to render this service,

NOW, THEREFORE, THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH:

ARTICLE I

The contractor agrees to prepare a report on completed research in Behavioral Sciences relating to foreign policy.

ARTICLE II

In completion of this project, the Contractor agrees to perform services and abide by stipulations as follows:

1. The contractor is to research and produce work of at least (72) pages consisting of approximately 320 screened articles, books, and fugitive material, items representing completed research of noteworthy quality, cited and annotated, indexed by machine methods on an average of 15 entries per item (approximately 5,000 in all), typed by machine printer and electric typewriter, with explanatory introduction and commentary, pasted up as mechanicals ready for offset photo-reproduction and printing.

- The contractor will also submit a set of 3x5 cards containing each item of the bibliography, will full citation and annotation, indexed by subject categories, and within these categories alphabetically by authors.
2. The contractor shall submit a report of not less than seventy-two pages plus 3x5 cards to the Director, External Research Staff, Bureau of Intelligence and Research on or before October 15, 1964.
 3. All liaison in connection with this study will be with the Director, External Research Staff, Bureau of Intelligence and Research; including any oral or written instructions that may be given concerning the study.
 4. The contractor shall defray all expenses incident to the completion of the study, including cost of supplies, equipment, services and all travel.

ARTICLE III

The Department agrees to pay the Contractor for this project the sum of \$4,363.00. Progressive payments are hereby authorized to be made as follows:

\$436.30 to be paid the contractor upon certification by William J. Nagle, Director, External Research Staff, Bureau of Intelligence and Research that each 1/10 of the study has been completed in a satisfactory manner.

Final 1/10 to be paid the contractor upon certification by William J. Nagle, Director, External Research Staff, Bureau of Intelligence and Research that the study has been completed in a satisfactory manner.

ARTICLE IV

The period of this agreement shall extend from date of execution through October 15, 1964.

ARTICLE V

This contract is subject to the attached General Provisions, except 4, 11, 12 (a), 13 (b) (c)
