Government Activity (Executive branch)

An inventory in dynamic form of federal governmental operations in the United States today. The inventory is formed on the question: "Who is authorized to use what means to affect what behavior of whom?" Operations so included are analyzed according to a master classification system based upon the question, and the results of the analysis are coded and punched on cards preliminary to further analysis. The unit of analysis is presently the "program" as that concept is used in the U.S. Budget; it is a broad concept and programs vary greatly in size. The format of the program analysis follows.
