Subject: Vietnam Source Materials Index

1. There exists no exhaustive compendium of studies (classified and unclassified) on Vietnam. The lists that exist are partial, mostly unannotated, and, most important, are not indexed in depth.
2. Officials, military officers, contractors, and scholars need such a list, to lay their hands on certain materials promptly, to check for duplications of subjects and methodologies when ordering or conducting research, to do background work efficiently prior to decisions and studies, to locate personnel, and for other purposes.
3. The index in depth and the catalogue with annotations can be provided by Simulmatics Corporation in cooperation with the Princeton Research Publishing Company's Universal Reference System under a sub-contract.
4. Phases of the project are as follows:
 1. Documents assembly and screening (est. 2500 docs)
 2. Documents coding by trained analysts.
 3. Publication of CODEX (machine-generated catalogue and index) in 300 copies of approximately 1100 pages, hard-bound.
5. Costs of the project would be:
 1. Ten man-months.....\$13,000
 2. Computer generation..... 2,000
 3. Computer print-out..... 2,000
 4. Printing and binding..... 2,400
 5. Special costs of work done in Vietnam..... 3,000
 6. OH, travel, procurement of materials..... 11,000
