Since we were last in touch, the Saigon conference was held and you went to the congress at Southampton. Musch sent me a description of the mixed reactions there. Perhaps you have something to add. Did you encounter sympathetic potential collaborators or supporters, that's the question.

We are going ahead with the formation of an Association. A statement of its purposes is attached. Your comments have been borne in mind, but should you have further comment please let me have it. The HQ is to be in Geneva, and we are looking forward to a Museum there sponsoring a hall for us to exhibit the best of our wares to the public. More on that another time. At the moment I am preparing to depart for the States, to be

gone for several weeks, thereafter returning here for the winter. And before leaving I wished to ask whether you might join with the prospective list of contributors writing on the subjects more or less as outlined in the attached page. Retitle your piece if you wish. You may wish to develop the article you already published or to do a new one. Although I would prefer to see you do the foot-slogging type of field-work article, there would be room in it, besides the case or two, for the kind of technical counsel contained in your letter to me of the 13th August. (But even if you don't include this because the cases take up all your space, I can paraphrase you or quote you elsewhere.)

I hope that you will join us in this attempt to show the world that not just one but many fertile sites exist, each defensible by itself and then all confirming themselves by lending mutual support.
